

Peaceful View picnic shelter and restroom are located at a junction of several trails near Elderberry and Spencer's S trailheads. During the winter, a temporary warming hut, with stove, is erected on the Twisted Klister snowshoe trail. **Maps** of the 4th of July trail system are available on the club's website.





Places to Nordic Ski in North Idaho:

4th-of-July Pass*

12.1 mi (19.4 km) of groomed ski trails with a total of 17.8 mi (28.5 km) of skiing. 15.7 mi (25.1 km) of snowshoe trails.

English Point, Hayden

Approximately 6 mi (9.7 km) of ungroomed multi-use trails (No permit required).

Palouse Divide*

8 mi (12.9 km) of groomed ski trails with a total of 20 mi (32.3 km) of skiing.

Priest Lake Area*

Numerous areas for skiing and snowshoeing including the golf course, Hanna Flats, Rocky Point and Coolin Mtn trail systems and Indian Creek State Park.

Farragut State Park**

Approximately 18 mi (28 km) of groomed ski trails and 6 mi (9.7 km) miles of snowshoe trails.

A Park N'Ski Permit is required to use the 4th of July Recreation Area from November 15 thru April 30. They are available for a fee of \$25.00 for an annual permit or \$7.50 for a 3-day permit. The permit may be used at 17 Park N'Ski locations in Idaho and can also be used in Oregon.


Washington has a separate program and does not honor Idaho permits. Permit proceeds go directly toward trail maintenance and winter grooming.
