

4th of July Ski Area

Approximately 25 miles of ski trail and snowshoe trails with 8 miles for track skiing.

Dogs not allowed on groomed ski trails

4 Snowshoe trails which all allow dogs

Back country trails, nearly unlimited.

Sky Walker to Elk Mt is 7.5 miles, 2.5 miles up Elk Mt and it is possible to ski to Beauty Saddle. These trails are ungroomed, backcountry trails.

Restrooms in parking lot and another restroom further up the groomed trail.

Warming hut 1/4 mile in from the parking lot and Ian's Eagle Warming Hut is 5 miles further.

USFS, Idaho Parks and Recreation and the Panhandle Nordic Ski and Snowshoe Club cooperate to maintain this area for recreation.

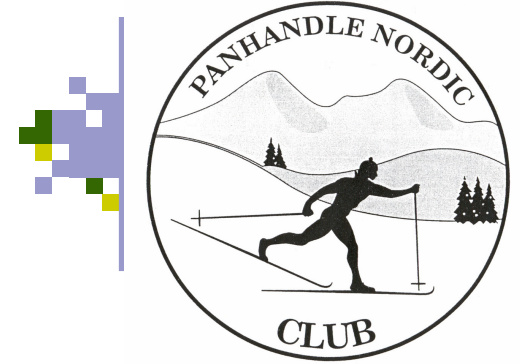

Meetings

General meetings are held throughout the winter on the **1st Tuesday** of each month (the exception being election day in November when we move the meeting to the second Tuesday) at 7 pm at the U.S. Forest Service (Fernan) Ranger Station located at 2502 E. Sherman Ave., Coeur d'Alene, ID. Members and guests drive around to the back of the building. Besides a short business section, each meeting consists of an information program about Nordic Skiing, such as equipment and techniques, or other outdoor recreation interests. It is a good way to meet people who like to cross-country ski and snowshoe and to become involved in the promotion of Nordic skiing in the Coeur d'Alene area.

Touring

Throughout the winter season we meet as groups to ski or snowshoe locally, as well as taking daylong and overnight trips to other winter sports areas.

Ya-I-Du-Ski awards are given for cumulative distances skied or snowshoed in a season.

XC-Ski Classes

Instruction is sought and/or offered based on the interests and requests of Club members. The Club also participates in the annual statewide Ski-Free Day offering coaching for beginners – besides coffee and cookies – at the Fourth-of-July Pass Ski Area warming hut.
